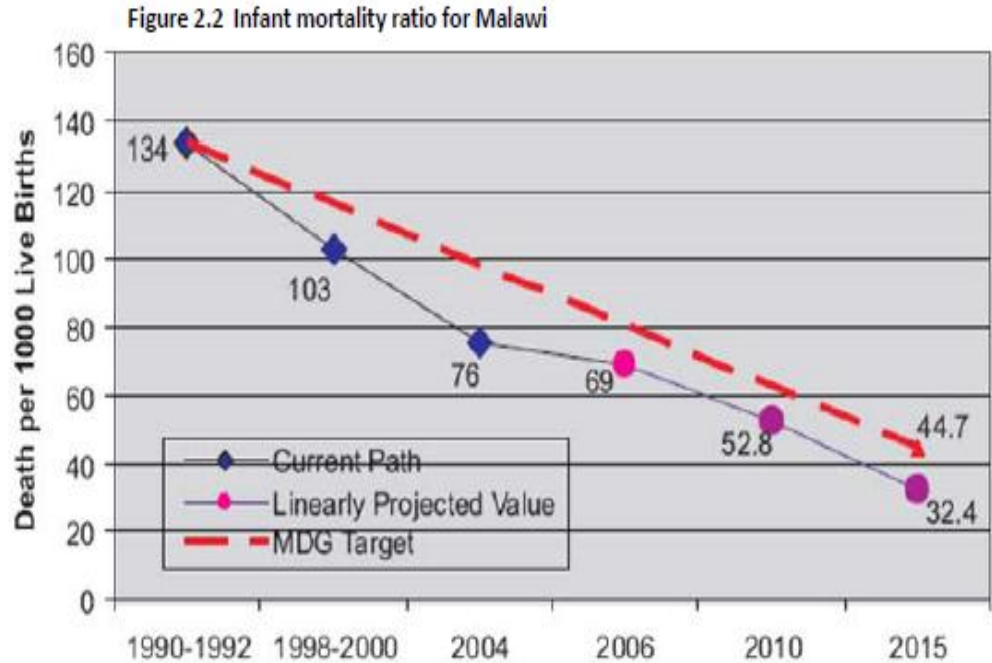

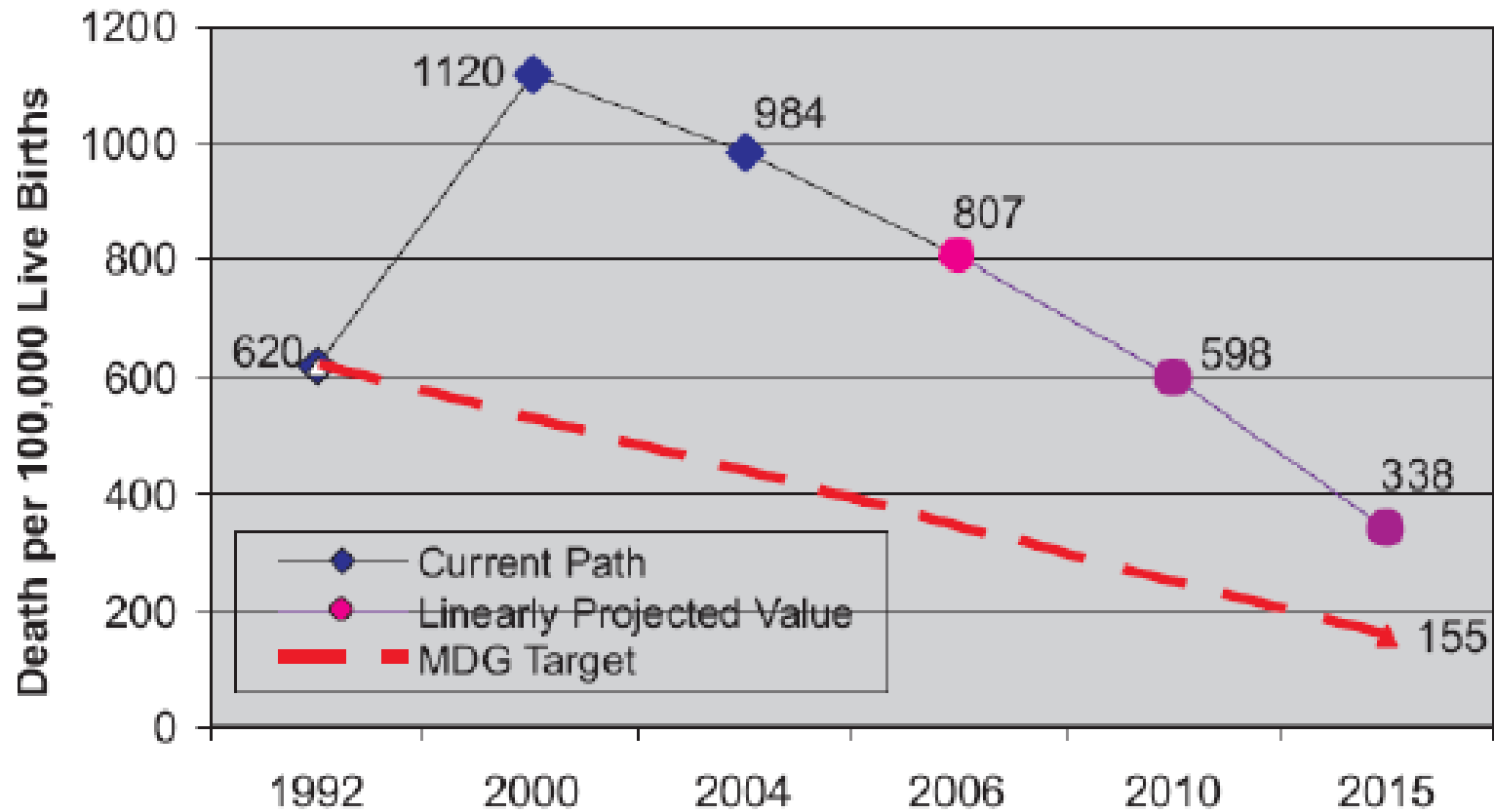
U5 mortality:

- 2015 = 59

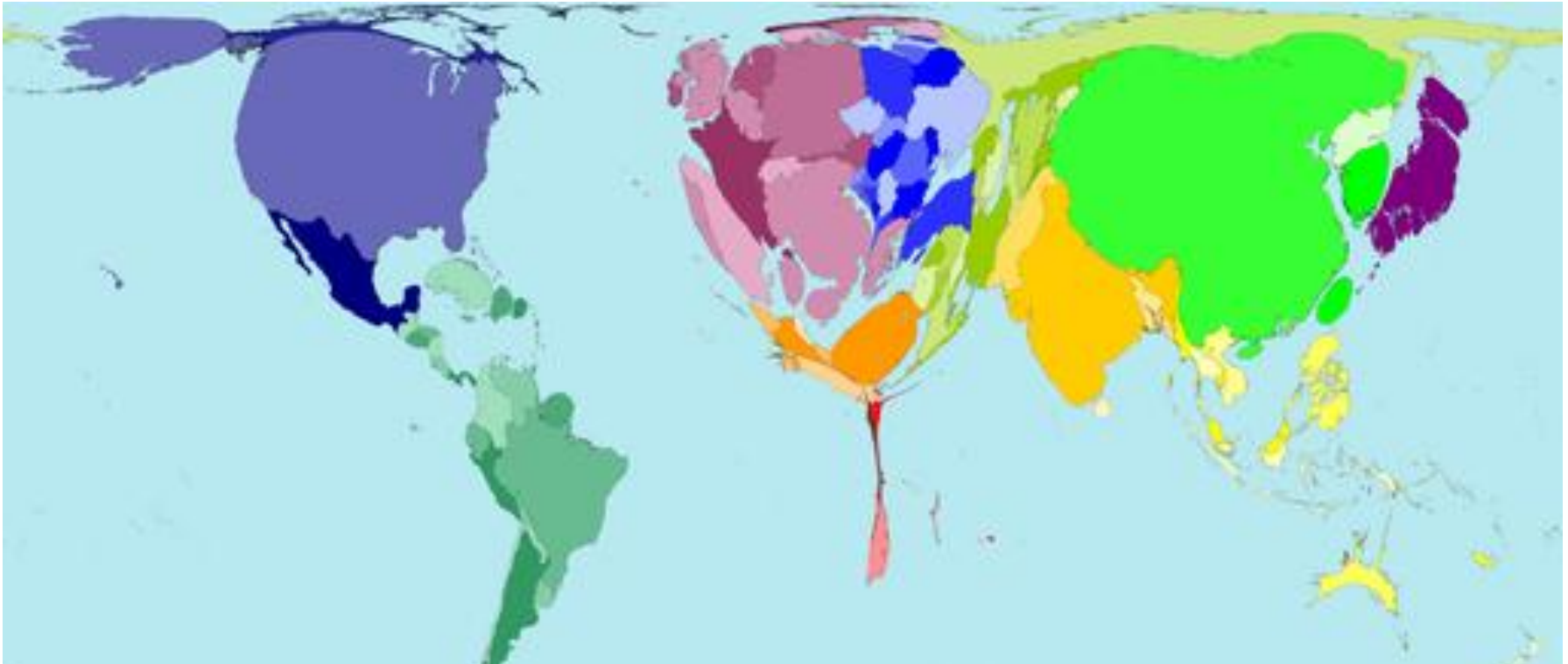


Will fail MDG 5

The Earth – doctors per head population

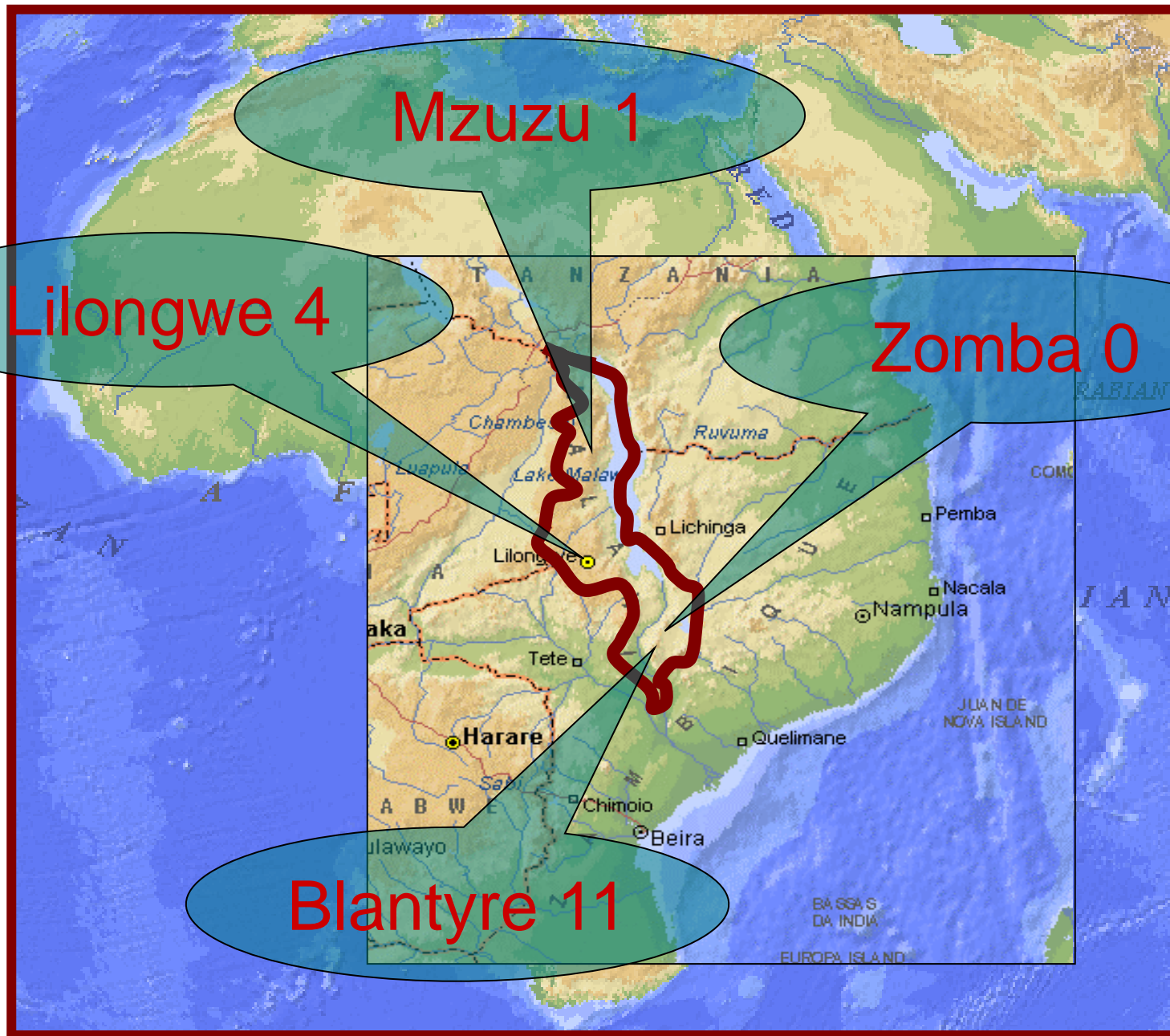


Malawi: 2 doctors per 100,000 people
16 paediatricians

QECH Paeds Dept

- 100,000 AE attendances
- 100 admissions / day
 - Malaria
 - Pneumonia
 - GE / dehydration
- 5-6% mortality
- 15,000 deliveries
- 3,000 neonates
- 11 paediatricians – 7 Malawian





Postgrad training

Pre 2005: 12 sent to UK. Only 2 returned

MMED 2005 – date:

- 2 years in Malawi (general paed, basic neonates)

- 2 years in RSA

6 graduates – 5 in Malawi

2 at MMED 2 level

6 at MMED 1

Funding sources erratic – particularly for RSA years

MoH: verbal >> financial commitment
